Ways to help your child learn spellings - the more fun the better!

- LCSWC look, cover, say, write, check
- Make flashcards of the spellings - turn one over and your child has to spell that word out
- Make 2 sets of flashcards for the spellings and play pairs
- Make spellings with magnetic letters
- Stairsteps: Write the words as if they are stairs, adding one letter at a time.

- Rainbow spelling write each letter in a different colour
- · Underline the tricky bit
- Think of rhyming words or words that follow the same pattern
- Break the word into syllables
 e.g. Monday would become monday
- Write the spelling words in flour, jelly, sand, shaving foam
- Find words within words e.g
 when has the word hen in with a w at the front
- Make up silly sentences for the words e.g because
 Big elephants can't always use small exits
- Play spelling games on the computer
