WELLINGTON PRIMARY SCHOOL UNIT C - YEAR 4 Spring 2 – 2023

English

Read and write poetry about ambition.

Use the 'The Tunnel' by Anthony Browne as inspiration for writing. Children will be developing the use of more ambitious vocabulary into more complex sentences.

Maths

Learn + & - facts to make 10 & 20 x2, 10, 5, 3, 4, 6, 7, 8 & 9 tables how to solve word problems money and introducing decimals

mental strategies for + & written methods for + - x and ÷ quick multiplication method measurements

Science Living Things and their Habitats

We will recognise that living things can be grouped in a variety of ways. We will make and use our own classification keys to help identify a variety of living things. We will investigate a 'leaf litter' habitat and explore examples of human impact on environments.

Computing Datalogging (Continued)

We will consider how and why data is collected over time and how computers can use special input devices called sensors to monitor the environment. Learners will collect data as well as access data captured over long periods of time. They will look at data points, data sets, and logging intervals.

Basic Skills Mini Module 3

The children will develop their research, typing and presentation skills in an activity linked to their topic work.

<u>Cross-Curricular Computing</u> Health, Well-being and Lifestyle

Children will begin to understand that the use of technological devices can impact both positively and negatively on their lives. They will discuss how prolonged screen-time can have an impact on their physical and mental health.

Privacy and Security

Children will develop awareness of strategies to keep information private and will understand that internet use is never fully private and is monitored.

<u>P.S.H.E.</u> Physical Health and Well-being: What Is Important to Me? (continued)

The children will learn why people may eat or avoid certain foods according to their personal choice, religious, moral, cultural or health reasons. We will also learn about the importance of sleep.

R.E.

How Do the Five Pillars of Islam Guide Muslims in Life?

This topic will expand and develop learning about the Five Pillars of Islam as a way of focusing on key beliefs for Muslims. Children will learn about some key teachings and consider how these reflect and affect the values and lives of believers.

Geography Extreme Geography (continued)

The children will learn about how volcanoes are formed and use atlases to discover where they are located in the world. They will find out how eruptions affect the world and the people who live nearby.

<u>P.E.</u>

Fitness

Children continue to develop components of fitness, such as strength, speed, aerobic fitness and coordination. Children will show good control and coordination when performing skills in combination.

Gymnastics

Children will develop skills of balance, co-ordination and body control whilst taking part in gymnastics sessions. They will perform a variety of rolls, jumps, leaps and balances with greater control. They will also link actions together to create routines with and without the gymnastics apparatus.

Art 3D Sculptures - Bodies

The children will be researching and evaluating a range of artists and their works. The pupils will learn the different styles of the artists and how this has influenced their work when creating images/sculptures of the human body.

Music Ukulele

We will continue to work with Mr Stokes from the Bradford Music Service to develop our understanding of musical vocabulary and improve our skills using pulse and rhythm. We will learn how to play some simple tunes on the ukulele and broaden our knowledge of different musical chords.

French Les Animaux (continued)

We will learn the words for pets and other animals and how to describe their colour, size and characteristics so that we can talk about them and produce written descriptions.
