Agenda item 8 - Interest in the working party on RSE has been high and there has been a lot of work put into this within Bradford. There quite strong feelings amongst some parents and this needs to be progressed after October half-term.

RG will attend the working party meeting and DP will attend as a Governor representative.

The group will consist of parents, governors and staff.

JW will lead on arranging the meetings.

A report will be provided to Governors at the next GB meeting.

It was agreed that each class link Governor visit will have a focus based on the School Imp Plan.

The website committee list is to be updated.

#### 11. NEW OFSTED FRAMEWORK

MA delivered a PowerPoint presentation on the new framework.

The emphasis is now looking at a more balanced curriculum in schools.

How this relates to primary schools in particular was stressed and a move away from purely focussing on Maths and English has taken place.

How the curriculum is covered during an inspection with SLT and middle leaders was outlined.

Quality of education and behaviour for learning are key areas.

The 3 core functions of those responsible for governance were displayed and detailed.

- The Vision, Ethos and Strategic direction are also a key part of the SIP.
- Holding the leadership to account
- Ensuring value for money.

AS advised that there is also a new focus with the SFVS this year.

How the quality of education judgement will be arrived at was explained in detail including curriculum design, teaching pedagogy, assessment, attainment & progress, reading and readiness for the next stage of education.

JW noted that foundation subjects have always been covered at Wellington and a review of these is taking place by the leadership team. Quality of learning and progression is being pursued.

JP summarised how the topics have been reviewed throughout the foundation subjects including that these need to be relevant to the local community.

New teacher induction was queried by AS in respect of the ethos of the school and this was outlined by JP and JW.

JW advised that good learning behaviours are embedded in the pupils through the Growth Mindset strategy.

Q – Does Inspire Maths fit in?

A – Yes, this was seen by the inspectors as challenging the higher achievers.

Q - Are the less able achieving?

A – Yes this has helped to bring them on by the use of coaching partners.

Higher aspiration is being encouraged this year. JP outlined how this has been progressed in school including the introduction of a career's week in school. It is hoped this will open up the wider world to the pupils.

MA advised that Leeds Beckett also do a lot of work with primary school in this regard.

#### 12. HEADTEACHER'S REPORT

The Headteacher's report had been circulated prior to the meeting.

Staffing Personnel – The Teaching staffing structure for 2019-20 was detailed in the report.

Attainment & Progress – The data dashboard on BSO was displayed and is available to all Governors.

The comparative data with Bradford and National over 5 years was displayed and the differences between Boys and Girls data was explained.

The key points of the data were included in the written report.

JW explained how the data is tracked over a 4-year period.

AS noted the benefits of the information being available in the different year groups covering EYFS, Yr1,2 and 6.

Middle leaders are now much more proactive in reviewing action plans for targeted pupils.

The biggest disappointment was in the reading outcomes at the end of KS2.

Discussions with other schools have highlighted the differences in access arrangements and this was explained by JW.

## Q – What are we doing between Yr2 and Yr6?

## A- Inspire has helped with Maths and it is hoped to help with Reading.

Rising Stars is used at Fagley and this has proved to be successful. The challenging nature of the programme was explained.

Fluency in reading is being promoted this year.

Staff expectations of pupils not being high enough was also noted as an issue by MA.

JW stressed the need for Reading to improve based on the results seen.

Access arrangements in relation to the emphasis on the new framework was discussed in detail.

The differential between boys and girls is still evident.

The SLT will review the middle leaders plans and JP outlined how discussions are held over strategies to be employed with particular pupils.

It is hoped that the scrutiny will be greater now in Yr's 3,4&5 and that the level of catch up needed in Yr6 is reduced.

JW noted her intentions to improve on the outcomes seen this year which is seen as a blip rather than a trend.

A meeting of the SLT took place prior to the holidays and a strategic plan was created to address the issues encountered.

## Q - Have the required Nursery numbers been achieved?

A - Not as yet. This is the first year ever that nursery has not been filled.

There are 10 am and 5 pm vacancies at present and there will be a clawback of monies at the October census.

Breakfast club has now commenced at the school and DP advised that parents feel this is expensive. This is being closely monitored and JW noted that this cannot run at a loss.

#### 13. SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN 2019-20

A new format for the SIP had been circulated prior to the meeting.

The SIP was requested to be circulated in the new template.

JW had circulated the School Improvement objectives agreed at the Training Day prior to the meeting.

## Q - Pupil questionnaire - is something which driven by the pupils to be included in the SIP?

A – The school council is now being promoted as the student voice in school and this where issues can be raised.

## 19. ANY OTHER BUSINESS

A Parent governor election will be held to replace Ruth Gray who has tendered her resignation.

There are also 3 vacancies for Co-opted governors to be filled.

How to market the vacancies was discussed in detail.

JW advised that Deputy Heads have been encouraged to take a role on other schools' GB's at BEOP.

The school website was noted as a good place to advertise for potential governors.

A letter will be sent out by EGB advising of the Parent governor and Co-opted governor vacancies.
