Rogdoons

There are thirty-five species of rogdoons living in the universe, including the greea, the smarta and the lamlan. Some of which can be very dangerous, whereas others are harmless and incredibly friendly.



What do they look like?

Rogdoons are extremely strong creatures with a multitude of large bulging muscles, particularly along their arms. Covering their entire body, are fine purple hairs which stand on end whenever they become frightened. On their face, rogdoons possess two piercing black eyes positioned just above an oval shaped nose.

What do they eat?

What rogdoons eat depends entirely on the species it is and where it lives. Friendly breeds of rogdoons, such as greea, are particularly fond of bluebells and dandelions whereas lamlans are very predatory creatures, hunting small rodents and family pets.

Habitats

Behaviour

The majority of rogdoons are easily trained and can be kept as pets in an average sized family home, without the need for a license.
